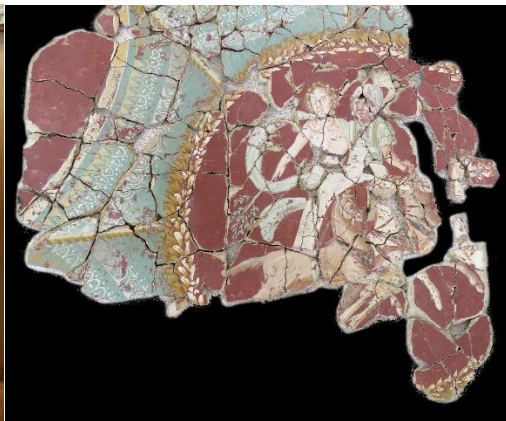


## Visit of the Restoration Centre with the ceiling paintings from Celeia (1.30 h)

The Restoration Centre of the Institute for the Protection of Cultural Heritage of Slovenia has its studios at Poljanska cesta 40 in Ljubljana and performs main and most complex conservation-restoration and restoration works on monuments of all kinds, including both movable and immovable heritage. The Centre takes also care for the development and the direction of the conservation-restoration and restoration profession in Slovenia. It consists of seven departments: Project planning department, Department for natural science research, Department for classic canvas painting, Department for murals and mosaics, Department for wood, Department for stone and stuccowork, Department for metals, ceramics and other materials and the Documentation department.

One of the main current conservation-restoration projects of the Centre involves fragments of Roman ceiling paintings found in Celje, Roman Celeia.
